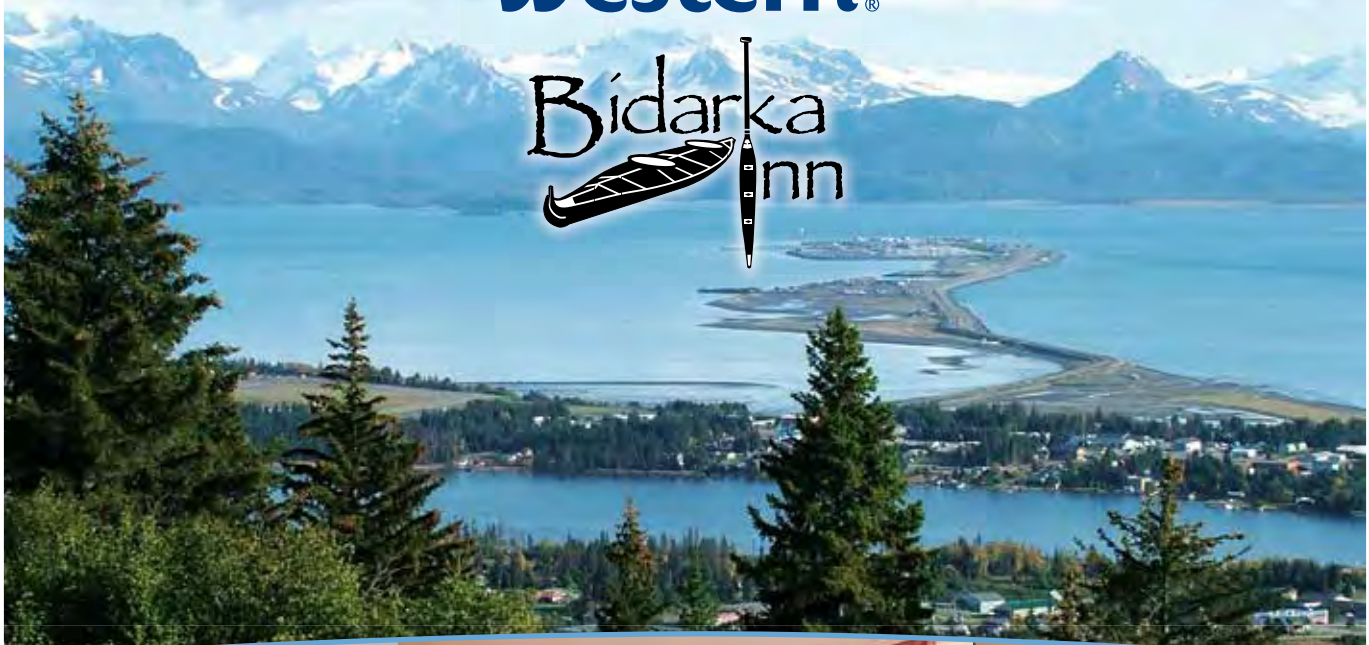

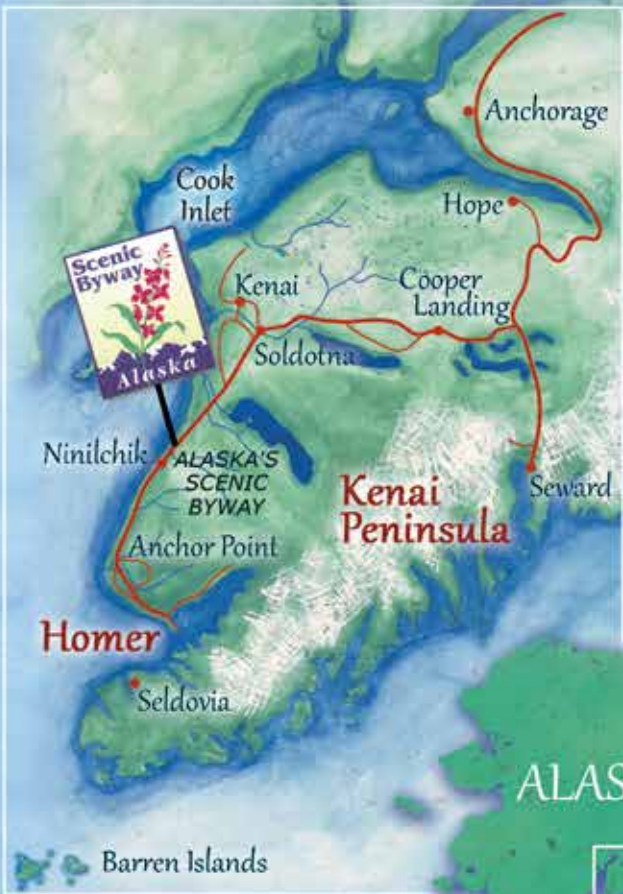
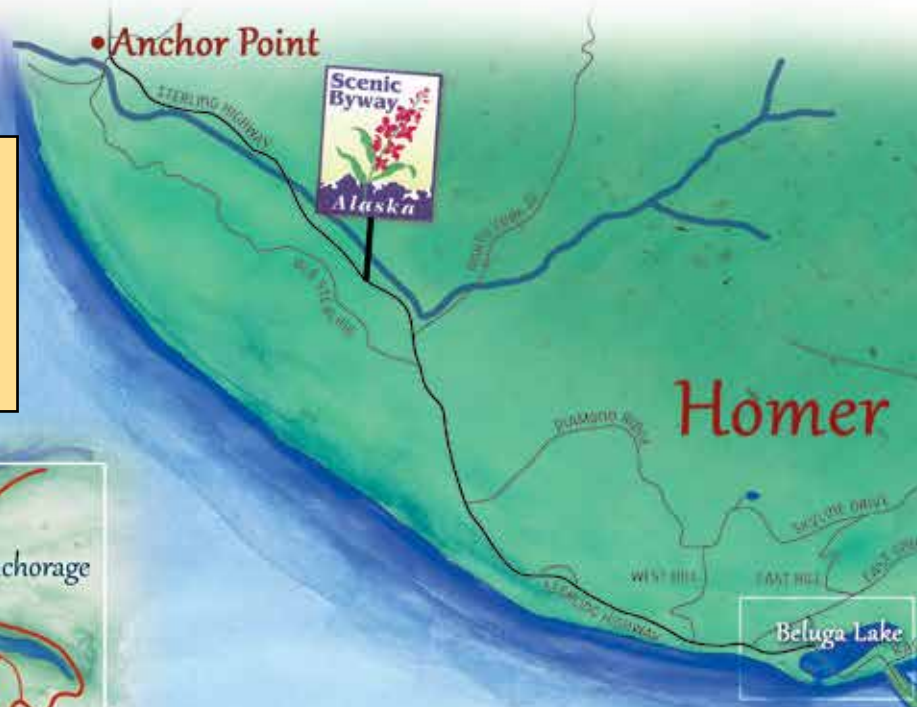
GETTING TO HOMER

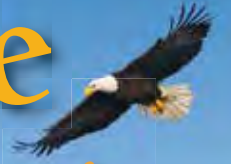
