This year's festival will offer over 100 events for all ages and abilities to celebrate the spring migration of Alaska's shorebirds. Registration will open *March 22* on our website.

We look forward to our Keynote Speaker Ted Floyd, the longtime Editor of Birding Magazine, the award-winning flagship publication of the American Birding Association (ABA). He has written five bird books, including the Smithsonian Field Guide to the Birds of North America (HarperCollins) and How to Know the Birds (National Geographic), and he has three more on the way.

This year's Festival Artist, Torie Rhyan, created our unique artwork which features the red-necked phalarope, this year's featured shorebird. We know you'll also enjoy workshops and presentations from the 2024 Schantz Scholar, Adriana Nelson, a recent graduate with a BS in Biology from Appalachian State University and the ABA 2020 Young Birder of The Year. The Center for Alaskan Coastal Studies, the Pratt Museum, and Kachemak Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve are key program partners and will offer education and fun activities throughout the festival. We have scheduled several tours and talks by knowledgeable Alaska birders and researchers.

Kachemak Bay, located in Homer, Alaska, provides miles of shoreline and intertidal habitat for migrating birds. Kachemak Bay's unique ecology, easy accessibility to beaches, and the scenic landscapes of Homer, make this a prime location to experience this annual migration. Kachemak Bay is a site of International Significance in the Western Hemisphere Shorebird Reserve Network.

The Board of Friends of Alaska National Wildlife Refuges will host **Birders Coffee at 9 a.m. Sunday, May 12**. This will provide an opportunity to learn about our organization, share your bird sightings, chat with our presenters (including Keynote Ted Floyd!), and pick up any auction items you have won.

We continue cruising along the coast viewing sea ducks, otters, seals, and wildlife to Glacier Spit and Rusty's Lagoon. The hike begins with your guide leading you along Glacier Spit, Kachemak Bay on one side, Rusty's Lagoon on the other, with viewing opportunities for a diversity of birds and wildlife, shorebirds, raptors, kingfishers, loons, otters, seals, porpoise. The trail, over the level glacier moraine, opens to Grewingk Glacier Lake, dotted with icebergs, the glacier is a backdrop surrounded by mountain peaks. Return through an old growth coastal forest, with views of Halibut Cove to meet your water taxi pick-up. This is a 6-mile hike with a steep uphill and downhill section. 

SPRING SIGHTINGS

KACHEMAK BAY BIRDERS



Kachemak Bay is home not only to the spring shorebird migration, but also many other hardto-find bird species as well. Early May brings the first warblers and swallows to Homer, along with sandhill cranes, Arctic and Aleutian terns, fork-tailed storm-petrels and puffins, both tufted and horned. Cormorants, common murres and black-legged kittiwakes can be found near their nesting sites on Gull Island, and common eider, pigeon guillemot, marbled and Kittlitz's murrelets are visible on Kachemak Bay. Also hermit and varied thrush, greater white-fronted, Canada and snow geese, trumpeter swans as well as savannah and fox sparrows and Lapland longspur, horned larks, and American pipits!

Look for Eurasian wigeons in Mud Bay and on Beluga Lake. Find American three-toed and hairy woodpeckers in the spruce wood areas. The southside of Kachemak Bay's northern temperate coastal rainforest attracts different species from the drier north shore and boreal forest. Though not a shorebird, the bald eagle can be spotted frequently on shore and in the sky. Many of the 236 species of birds recorded for Kachemak Bay may be visible during Shorebird Festival weekend.


